MESSAGE FROM THE FACULTY COORDINATOR, CSIE IIT MADRAS


Dear Reader,

Perhaps a day will come when we make a dent in corruption based on the ingenuity on display here.... Another competition with CSIE involvement was in waster management, with UKISEEN as partner. Two of the three prize-winning teams were from IIT Madras, something for the home institution to take pride in.

The bread-and-butter of what CSIE delivers continues to be technology commercialization, capacity building and livelihood enhancement. CSIE's transfer of a biochar technology developed by MCRC to an entrepreneur is a successful case-study of technology commercialization. The TNPL-funded CSR project on capacity-building for "Farmer Producing Companies" is in its final phase, while the livelihood enhancement project at Pathamadai has given new life to the weavers of the region. Skill development is a new direction for CSIE, thanks to CSR funding from CPCL which is supporting two Centres in Nagappattinam District in IT and tailoring, resp. Planning for July launch are swing.

As CSIE grows in multifaceted strength, the support of the IITM campus and alumni community is ever more crucial to ensure its mission and vision are met. I look forward to increased communication and interaction with both stakeholders in CSIE and its success.

Gandhi Hazare Award (GHA) 2018-19

CSIE has launched a programme dedicated to Gandhiji and Shri Anna Hazare titled "Gandhi Hazare Award" for IITM students, where students in teams can propose technical solutions to fight corruption in the country. This idea is proposed and funded by Dr. Sarma N. Gullapalli, an alumnus of IIT-M, B.Tech 1964 batch.

CSIE has successfully finished the competition. 45 students from IIT Madras have formed 20 teams and participated in the Gandhi Hazare Award themed 'reducing corruption using technology'. 6 out of the 20 entries have reached the finals. The teams had to submit abstracts, full papers and videos as part of the competition. The total prize money for the competition is Rs. 45,000/-. Below are the top 3 entries:

Capacity Building Program for Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs)

CSIE organized final phase of its capacity building program as part of TNPL funded CSR project. The venue is decided to encompass 'Farmer Producer Companies' (FPCs) and promoting institutions of FPCs in western part of Tamilnadu. Resource persons included 'Executive Coaches', 'Commodity trading consultants', 'Banking officials' apart from scientists keen on technology transfer initiatives through FPOs. The program was organized with 'Regional Institute of Rural Development (RIRD), Bhavanisagar' as the venue partner. The program received commendable feedback from participants from more than 10 FPCs, 11 NGOs and delegates from agriculture departments of various zones.



CSIE is involved in the Business Development and Livelihood enhancement of Pathamadai weavers' community. After successful training, the weavers are now able to weave any kind of design into a korai mat. CSIE has appointed a young lady from the local community as the Marketing and Operations in-charge for the Pathamadai Co-operative Society who is now in a position to take up orders, get them done and fulfill delivery as per customer's requirement. CSIE has done the market promotion of the newly designed mats by gifting them to dignitaries and key people who helped in the project. They were overwhelmed by the results and progress. Skill Development Project in Nagapattinam District

CSIE has become a member of the team for a Village(s) Improvement Project, an initiative by CPCL. As part of it CSIE is launching two Skill Development Centres at three villages in Nagapattinam district namely Panangudi, Vellapakkam and Goparajapuram. Initially the skills will be in the areas of IT and Tailoring. These skills have been shortlisted from the initial baseline survey among the youth and in consultation with the head of these villages. The Centres are planned to be launched in July 2019.

UK India Social Entrepreneurship Education Network (UKISEEN) - National Conference

CSIE has sucessfully completed the 2nd edition of the UK India Social Innovation Challenge (UKISIC) the theme of the competition was Waste Management. A total of 37 teams have participated in the competition out of IIT-M teams win awards which 12 applications qualified for the finals. After a thorough evaluation by selected judges the top 3 applications have been selected. A total of 1,400 GBP prize money and certificates have been given to the winners.
